Horry County Police Department develops new initiative to clear up phone lines

HORRY COUNTY, SC (WMBF) New Horry County Police Chief Saundra Rhodes is working on an initiative to help keep officers out watching the streets. It all has to do with when you decide to pick up the phone and call "911." In the South Precinct, which protects Myrtle Beach, Carolina Forest. Socastee. Murrells Inlet and Garden City, the Horry County Police Department gets more than half of their calls for service. Officers want to make sure your needs are going to the

right place, so patrol officers can focus on keeping neighborhoods safe.

It can be as simple as knowing the difference between an emergency and a nonemergency. Nonemergencies still require an officer's attention, like general questions or to file a police report, where you can always call your local precinct. The department has desk officers there, so when you have an emergency, patrol officers won't have their hands tied up with calls.

"This is a big county," said Sgt. Robert Kegler with the Horry

County Police Department. "And there's different needs for different areas of the county. And it may just be something as simple as wanting to speak to an officer over the phone. And we have that capability."
