In many countries, children hunt for Easter eggs hidden about the home. Children in the United Kingdom, Germany, and some other countries play a game in which eggs are rolled against one another or down a hill. The egg that stays uncracked the longest wins. Since 1878, children in Wash-



ington, D.C. have been invited to roll eggs on the White House

Easter promenades of people in new clothes are a tradition in many European towns and villages. A person holding a cross or an Easter candle leads some of these promenades. In New York City, thousands of people stroll in the Easter Parade down Fifth Avenue to show off their new clothes following Easter services.

## SOUTH CAROLINA STATE FLAG HISTORY



Asked by the Revolutionary Council of
Safety in the fall of
1775 to design a flag
for the use of South
Carolina troops, Col.
William Moultrie chose
a blue which matched
the color of their uniforms and a crescent
which reproduced the

silver emblem worn on the front of their caps. The palmetto tree was added later to represent Moultrie's heroic defense of the palmetto-log fort on Sullivan's Island against the attack of the British fleet on June 28, 1776. History of the S.C. State Flag goes back to 1775. The Crescent and the Palmetto Tree were not together on the first flag.







# A Message from the P.O.A. Board:

We have been meeting monthly since December, 2004. We are working diligently to assure everyone that all homeowners are treated fairly and equitably. We will do all we can to keep Covington Lake a community we can all be proud of.

One way to accomplish this is to enforce the Homeowner Covenants, which we all signed and agreed to when we moved in. Here are a few covenants for your review. These are abbreviated, so please refer to your copy for the complete verbiage.

### LOT MAINTENANCE-Section 7

Each owner shall maintain his/her lot in order to avoid decreasing the beauty of our neighborhood.

### NUISANCES-Section 8

No noxious, unlawful or offensive activity shall be carried on upon any lot.

### SIGNS-Section 10

No signs of any kind (i.e. "No Trespassing") shall be placed on any lot.

### OFF-STREET PARKING-Section 19

No trailers, boats or commercial vehicles shall be parked on any common area, streets or lots except in an approved garage and completely sheltered from view.

PETS - Section 21

All pets must be leashed.

In case you are unaware, South Carolina has a law that states that all pets must be leased when not in a fenced area. This is for everyone's protection.

There have been incidents reported to the Board, of unleashed dogs attacking other pets while they are being walked. We are sure you will agree that this is totally unacceptable. Everyone should have the right to feel safe while walking their pet.
