



The following 4 items were the top priorities (as ranked by the homeowners) from a 2005 survey:

Lake Cleanup Lake Aeration Lake Fountains

Front Entrance Landscaping upgrade

Using this information, the board took this into consideration as it planned the 2007 budget since the 2006 budget was in place prior to the 2005 meeting.

Our annual expense line total of \$109,560 requires an operating budget of the same figure. The Board carefully reviewed all requests, expenses and worked up several budget proposals. The 2007 quarterly assessments of \$110.00 are up from \$79.00 last year, which is necessary to support the projects important to maintaining the quality of our community. The surrounding neighborhoods in our community continue to expand with many new competing developments. Even with our fee increase, we will continue to have one of the lowest fee rates in the Carolina Forest area.

Our Budget plan is broken into 4 areas of expense. A comparison of the 2006 projected with the 2007 plan follows:

 Repairs and Maintenance 39,402 projected in 2006 vs. 66,391 plan in 2007

 General and Admin:
 33,225 projected in 2006 vs. 31,175 plan in 2007

 Utilities:
 8,785 projected in 2006 vs. 9,675 plan in 2007

Other Expenses (Reserves) 1,762 projected in 2006 vs. 2,319 plan in 2007

Total: 83,174 projected in 2006 vs. 109,560 plan in 2007

A detail of these accounts is attached.

From the November 28 meeting, a detailed breakout of the proposed landscape improvements has been included.

Account **#0440** last year contained our landscape contract for lawn care (Casey's Lawn Service) along with plant materials, mulch, and fertilizer and irrigation repairs.

In 2007, this account was split into two accounts. **#0443** is our landscape contract services (Casey's Lawn Service) and **#0440** for plant materials and supplies.

In 2006, account **#0440** contained the Casey bill of **\$18,960** and **\$4,269** was spent on materials.

In 2007, account **#0443** is 19,000 and account **#0440** is 25,016. A breakdown of account **#0440** for 2007 is as follows:
